Beginning in 1988, the Gamma Mu Foundation was established to provide financial support to non-profit organizations that serve gay men and LGBT communities primarily in the rural and/or underserved areas of the United States. The Foundation awards direct financial grants to support HIV prevention and care programs, community services, research initiatives and public education efforts that directly benefits the LGBT community.

In addition, the Foundation also awards scholarships to gay men who demonstrate financial need and the desire to pursue additional education through academic or vocational programs. More recently, the Foundation has expanded academic scholarships to members of the broader LGBT community through its Named Scholarships initiative.

Finally, our mission as a non-profit charitable foundation is to make a positive difference in the lives of the LGBT community, primarily in rural and underserved communities of the United States.

For the Period Ending June 2023:

The Foundation received a total of \$194,000 in donations from over 100 donors during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023. This amount includes \$40,000 of net revenue from our Annual Celebration Fundraiser. Our portfolio gained over \$661,000, while our expenses amounted to \$50,000, mainly for accounting and computer services. The members of the Gamma Mu Foundation Board of Directors do not receive any form of compensation, and this has always been the case.

We awarded \$174,000 in grants, plus \$123,000 in scholarships, for a total of \$297,000 during the past fiscal year. These awards support our mission to effect positive change within the LGBT community. The scholarship and grant amounts that the Foundation has awarded over the last five years are detailed below.

The Foundation received a total of 99 grant applications for our current grant cycle, which runs from October 2022 to September 2023. Thirty-seven of these applications met the eligibility requirements and were accepted for review of which 21 proposals were accepted for funding. The total funding allocated for these projects amounted to \$179,000. The assessment criteria was in strict accordance with the Foundation's mission and vision, which entailed giving priority to activities related to HIV/STD prevention and care.

2023 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS TOTAL SCHOLARSHIPS - \$115,000

During our current scholarship year, which ends in the Fall term of 2023, we have received a total of 140 scholarship applications. Out of the total number of applicants, 32 scholarships were awarded, with 14 of them being specifically designated as Named Scholarships. The total funding allocated for scholarships amounted to \$115,000. Each of the 14 Named Scholarships given was valued at \$5,000. The remaining 18 scholarships were valued at \$2,500 each.
