As many of you know GMF conducted a donor survey over the past several months and was completed in January. The results are being documented and a report will be released shortly. We also want to thank the many people who took the time to respond and make this project meaningful.

We feel the survey results will help us plan for the future of GMF and maintain our goal of being an ongoing independent supporter of the LGBT community.

Fiscal Year 2023 Scholarships

Thirty Two Scholarships totaling \$115,000

Since the inception of the Scholarship Program in 1999, the number of awards and the amount of the awards has dramatically increased. This year we were able to fund \$115,000 for 37 scholarships.

We currently have 14 named scholarship awards. These named awards are by donors who have contributed the \$50,000 threshold necessary to name a scholarship award in perpetuity. Each named scholarship is for \$5,000. The remaining 18 scholarships are for \$2,500 each.

Meet Stephen Crocker New Member of the Board of Directors

I'm Stephen Crocker and recently joined the Gamma Mu Board after being a scholarship reviewer for about 3 years. I am currently also a reviewer for EQuality California (5 years) and previously was a reviewer for PFLAG (Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays); 5-6 years. I became a Gamma Mu donor in 2021 after discovering the website and the organization's outstanding priorities.

The three which most attracted the support of my husband Donald Jolly and I are: Scholarships are focused on gay males, the award structure is focused on a rural orientation, and the organization functions on an all-volunteer basis. On that basis, we are focusing our financial contributions to Gamma Mu now. Our goal is to establish at least one named scholarship in perpetuity; one of which we hope to achieve in the next year or two. After that, we would look forward to continuing donations on an annual basis.

I have served on the Board of Directors of the Silicon Valley Gay Men's Chorus in San Jose, California for 14 years, and am also a singer. I am currently Vice President, and have served as President for 5 years and Vice President for 3. My main interested has been in financial issues, and have also assisted with marketing and membership development. I also was a Board member for the Tabard Theatre Co. in San Jose.

As a Gamma Mu Board member, I would like to help promote the organization's mission and contribute to its continuing growth by helping to develop additional outreach capabilities involving our scholarship and donor base. I also have administrative, project management, non-profit board/LGBTQ board, financial oversight, and marketing experience, which hopefully can be of assistance to Gamma Mu. Less Labels, Please

Gen Z has become known as the generation with the most our LGBTQ+ individuals, but recent research reveals that it is also the generation most likely to embrace nonspecific labels.

Among 18 to 26 year-olds, 26 percent said they identify as something "other than straight," according to a recent poll from *Business Insider* and YouGov. This compares to 15 percent of millennials, 11 percent of Gen X, and 7 percent of baby boomers.

Gen Z is more likely to identify under the umbrella term of "queer" rather than a specific label. Five percent self-identify as queer, compared to to just 1 percent of millennials and Gen X and less than 1 percent of Boomers.

Gen Z is also more likely to embrace the labels like "bisexual" and "pansexual," as opposed to more binary terms that suggest they're only attracted to one type of person, such as "gay" or "lesbian." Thirteen percent of Gen Z identify as bisexual, compared to seven percent millennials and four percent of Gen X. Only 1 percent of Boomers identify as bisexual.

However, researchers noted that this does not necessarily mean there are more bi/pan people in today's generation, but that the data could instead suggest more youth today just feel more comfortable coming out and being open about their sexuality.

Many respondents also stated that they sometimes alternate between labels depending on the context, using the term queer in tandem with others, such as lesbian or gay. One 24-year-old respondent said that she primarily uses queer but added that "I also think lesbian a political meaning, so I like that work as well."

Another 21-year-old respondent said he uses both queer and gay, but tends to use queer because "some people like to miscategorize [gay] as excluding people."

SOME GOOD NEWS FOR THE LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY

A bill signed into law by Washington state Gov. Jay Inslee (D) will require schools in the state to teach LGBTQ+ history. First introduced in January, S.B. 5462 requires school districts to "[incorporate]

inclusive curricula and [select] inclusive instructional materials that include the histories, contributions, and perspectives of historically marginalized and underrepresented groups." That includes "people from various racial, ethnic, and religious backgrounds, people with differing learning needs, people with disabilities, LGBTQ people ... and people with various socioeconomic and immigration backgrounds."
