Fall is the time for us to focus on our plans for the upcoming year. In the next few months, we will begin our annual fall appeal. Which allows us to continue with our annual Grant and Scholarship awards.

New applications will be accepted for the next fiscal year in January.

During July and through September we awarded \$300,000 to our Grant and Scholarship winners. Your generous donation made this possible. Our funding provides only a small percentage of the requests for both Gants and Scholarships. Please consider an additional donation this year so that we can increase our awards.

We are also planning to implement changes based on the donor survey we recently completed, as well as holding "Celebration 25" fundraisers in Florida in January and Palm Springs in March.

You will soon get the new annual report sent to you, see a new interactive web site, have the opportunity to participate in the scoring process for our awards, and hopefully join our Annual meeting ZOOM call on Oct 2.

We look forward to a very active fall season, and urge you to consider your ongoing support to help make our goals a huge success.

Fiscal Year 2024 Scholarships

Thirty Five Scholarships totaling \$125,000

Since the inception of the Scholarship Program in 1999, the number of awards and the amount of the awards has dramatically increased. This year we were able to fund \$125,000 for 35 scholarships.

We currently have 15 <u>named scholarship</u> awards. These named awards are by donors who have contributed the \$50,000 threshold necessary to name a scholarship award in perpetuity. Each named scholarship is for \$5,000. The remaining 18 scholarships are for \$2,500 each.

Myles Chapman, Morehouse College, Georgia

The Gamma Mu Foundation is excited to spotlight Myles Chapman, one of our recent scholarship awardees! Myles received the Art Husky and Herman Phillips Memorial Scholarship, which recognizes up-and-coming LGBTQ+ leaders committed to

advocating for the community's rights and well-being. He was recently featured in an interview with a local ABC news affiliate in Denver, discussing LGBTQ+ inclusion.

Originally from Colorado, Myles has already made a remarkable impact as a young advocate, working to ensure that schools and communities become more inclusive and safer for LGBTQ+ youth. His dedication and leadership reflect this scholarship's very spirit and the Foundation's values.

"I am very thankful to receive a scholarship from the Gamma Mu

Foundation," wrote Myles. "The Art Husky and Herman Phillips Memorial Scholarship has made it easier for me to afford my college education as a first-generation college student, especially at a prestigious school like Morehouse College, a historically black college (HBCU) in Atlanta. It has uplifted me being a gay person of color because frequently my community is underrepresented."
